J. Terron Evertson, P.E., County Engineer



As county engineer, Mr. Evertson is responsible for all of the county's engineering regulatory affairs such as subdivision plat review, roadway signage, traffic speed studies, and FEMA floodplain program management. He started with Williamson County in October of 2010 and was named Williamson County's director of the Road & Bridge Division in May of 2011. As director, he was responsible for the design and maintenance of the county's 1,400-mile roadway system.

Mr. Evertson began his engineering career with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) where he served in various positions including as a design engineer for the Central Texas Turnpike Project (SH130, SH 45 and Loop 1), a construction engineer for the IH 35/SH 45 directional interchange, and as the TxDOT Austin District's director of Right of Way and Utilities. Mr. Evertson holds a bachelor's degree in civil engineering from the University of Texas at Austin, is a licensed Professional Engineer, a Certified Flood Plain Manager, and holds other certificates in roadway construction materials and inspection.

Prior to his engineering career, he honorably served in the United States Navy during Desert Shield and Desert Storm. In his free time, he volunteers as a coach and Scout leader for his children's activities. He was born and raised in the Central Texas area and has been married for 14 years to his wife, Karen. They have 11-year-old twins, Elizabeth and Jacob.

International Right of Way Association Weekly Update
Provided Monday, August 6, 2018



Trump Administration

- Mary Neumayr, the President’s nominee to serve as Chair of the Council on Environmental Quality, was approved by the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee Wednesday. The next and last stop in the process is for the full Senate to vote on her confirmation.

Congress

- Both Chambers are in recess this week. The Senate is scheduled to return next week to continue processing nominations. The House is scheduled to return after Labor Day.
- Before recessing, the Senate passed a “minibus” appropriations bill, including the appropriations for federal transportation programs. The House Appropriations Committee has passed its version of the transportation appropriations for fiscal year 2019, but the House has yet to vote on the measure.

Analysis

- While the Senate made significant progress on appropriations legislation last week, Congress has yet to send any FY 2019 appropriations bill to the President for his signature. When the House returns next month, there will be 11 legislative days when both Chambers will be in session prior to the expiration of government funding at the end of September. Layer on top of that calendar the ongoing partisan battle over Supreme Court-nominee Judge Kavanaugh and the President’s insistence that any funding package include funding for border security and we have the makings of another government shut-down fight weeks before the mid-term elections.
- The collateral damage, so to speak, from such a funding showdown is continued delay and lack of progress on infrastructure legislation, such as the water resources and aviation bills. While there is always a chance that infrastructure legislation moves during a lame duck session, at some point soon even sending the water resources and aviation bills to the President may become a challenge.

Region 2 Update

2018 International Board of Directors Update in Edmonton Alberta Canada:

Member Education Model Pilot Program: The 2017 IGC voted to allow Headquarters to contact Chapters that have not held courses in one or more years to see if they would like to participate in the pilot. The program is designed to have IRWA Headquarters (HQ) put on Courses within that Chapter. HQ will advertise, pay all expenses and will receive any revenue in the hope of holding more courses in the Chapter to support the needs of current members as well as help increase membership. Seven total chapters were identified and approached with two agreeing to participate. Chapter 43 with Region 2 agreed to opt into the program. The Pilot would begin July 1, 2018 and last for 1 year. At this time a plan for what happens after the 1 year has not been determined and will be discussed at the IGC meeting in September.

Motion that Non-Budgeted Project and/or initiatives over \$20,000 to be presented to the IGC for consideration and approval and that IGAC be provided with regular updates with regards to the given project and/or initiative and amended to reflect how revenue is being spent, with a review of all items that are over or under Budget by 10% or \$10,000.

New Governance Model: A session at the International Meeting was set up concerning the New Governance Model which has been worked on throughout the year during several different meetings. The purpose of the session was to discuss and receive the pro and con comments concerning three Governance Models which evolved from the past meetings from IRWA Chapter leadership. These comments will be utilized to develop a final Model to be presented at next year's International Conference in Portland, Oregon.

Many Region 2 members have requested information on the three scenarios. They have also asked if they could provide comments concerning those Models. I plan to request this information at the IGC meeting September 14 and 15 and ask for the ability to obtain comments from the membership of Region 2 in hopes that Region 2's comments will be taken into consideration when developing the final Model to be presented.

In all it was a good conference and I wish that everyone could have attended. It looks like we will have a lot to discuss at the 2019 Spring Forum in Austin and the 2019 International Conference in Portland so please plan on participating.
